27 **Legislative Update**

28 A. Mortell gives a legislative update. Active legislation can be found on the compact map on the PA  
29 Website: <https://www.pacompact.org/#compact>.

- 30 • Compact was enacted in North Dakota with substantive changes on 1/28/26. Commission staff  
31 and legal counsel will meet with appointment delegate and ND board to ensure the state’s  
32 participation adheres to the requirements of the Compact until the enacting legislation can be  
33 amended during the next legislative session. With New Jersey’s enactment in January, the PA  
34 Compact now has 21 Member States.
- 35 • Legislation is filed in 12 states—AL, AZ, FL, HI, IL, MA, MI, MO, NM, NY, PA, and SD.
- 36 • Legislation is anticipated in GA and RI but has not yet been filed.
- 37 • AL HB 156 has crossed over to the Senate. NM HB 10 has also crossed over to the Senate,  
38 though commission staff and legal counsel are working on addressing substantive changes in the  
39 bill.
- 40 • MI HB 4309 and PA HB 1961, both carried over from 2025, are under consideration in their  
41 respective state Senates.
- 42 • Most other filed legislation has received committee assignments in their house of origin.

44 **Committee Reports**

45 Rules – met Monday, February 9, 2026

- 46 • Committee reviewed public comments on draft rules 3 and 4 and made non-substantive  
47 changes. The rules will move on to a full commission vote. The committee will meet again in  
48 March to continue reviewing draft rules 5 (joint investigations) and 6 (fees).

50 Communications – committee has not met since last Executive Committee meeting.

52 Finance – committee has not met since last Executive Committee meeting.

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54 **AAPA/NCCPA Meeting Update**

- 55 • Chair Terranova updates the committee on a meeting earlier this month with AAPA and NCCPA,  
56 during which the Commission was requested to develop talking points to be used to assist with  
57 state readiness for onboarding to the compact data system.

87 **Delegate and Public Questions and Comments**

- 88 • J. Alley asks if the committee will review the state preparation guidelines document shared in  
89 the meeting materials.  
90 • Chair Terranova opens discussion on the guidelines, as they will be shared with AAPA as talking  
91 points:  
92 ○ J. Alley recommends adding to the data system section a qualifier that the information  
93 and process may be refined based on rule making and a state's ability to interact with  
94 the compact data system.  
95 ○ No objections to this change.  
96 • Chair Terranova states that the guidelines, as amended, will be shared with partner  
97 organizations as a resource to assist with state readiness.
